### Philippine Consulate Outreach 2024 By Nilo Mercado

PCSNJ hosted another yearly Philippine Consulate General Outreach mission last October 27, 2024. The purposes of the mission were the following: Renewal of the Philippine Passport, Application for Dual Citizenship, Special Power of Attorney and other Legal Matters regarding Immigrations.

The outreach was headed and organized by Alexis Santos with the participation of the PCSNJ President- Linda Juliano, President Elect- Jerry Ancheta and volunteers (mostly PCSNJ members). The volunteers assembled in the center at 7:00 o'clock in the morning for orientation, instruction and prohibition. Everyone was instructed precisely to show respect, patience and compassion to all applicants, because sometimes there will be unexpected offensive treatment that the volunteers may encounter.

The actual mission started exactly at 9:00 a.m. Enormous amount of people showed up with variety of needs regarding immigration services. The Consul Team was headed by the Deputy Consul General Ricarte Abejuela who supervised the whole process aided by Alexis Santos, Linda Juliano and Jerry Ancheta.

Astounding amount also of walk-ins were received with complaints of inability to make an appointment on line due to difficult access on scheduled outreach website. They said, the latter wasn't senior friendly or easy. Most of the applicants at that time were seniors and most of them are not computer literate or technology updated. Suggestion: Would it be possible that the Consul Team be lenient to process walk-ins application since their website are not friendly accessible. This problem was already brought up to the attention of the organizer-Alexis Santos.

However, in totality, the outreach was successful. Desired outcome was obtained. Couple of applicants underwent oath-takings as dual citizen, Passports were renewed and other legal documents were processed.

Closure of the mission was exactly at 3:00p.m. The Consul and his team were acknowledged by the organizer, PCSNJ members and volunteers with full of gratitude and appreciation of their services. Lastly, all participants of the outreach mission have their picture taken before the team's departure.

#### PCSNJ- UPMASA Lecture By: Arelyne Pacho-Ramos, MD



An educational seminar was held at Philippine Community Center in Stratford, N.J last November 17, 2024, Sunday. Sponsored by UPMASA (University of the Philippines Medical Alumni Society Association) chaired by Dr. Arelyne Pacho-Ramos and co-sponsored by the Educational Committee of PCSNI chaired by Emil Rotaeche along with the support of the University of the Philippines Medical Alumni.

The title of the topic was Heart to Heart, since the heart disease is the number one killer in the United States of America. Dr. Kenneth Dulnuan, an experienced Filipino Cardiologist in the United States was introduced by Dr. Liz De Leon. He shared his knowledge about preventing or slowing down of acquiring heart disease, stroke and diabetes mellitus. He accentuated more on healthy lifestyle like eating meats in moderation, fresh foods (not processed), less salt, less sugar, less fats, exercise and enough sleep for 7-9 hours. That's the kind of lifestyle he suggested everyone should follow if they want to live longer.

Chair yoga and low intensity exercises were introduced by Dana Loftus especially for seniors concluded the session.

Some experienced dancers, like Julius Jamora, will even offer to take the novices aside to give them one on one special assistance. Some new dances however, would rather just sit first, watch and then join when they feel they have learned the steps.



Line dancing is offered every Wednesday from 6:00 PM. The first hour is usually for new dancers where the emphases are on instructions and practice. Annabelle Macherron volunteers her time teaching the new dancers by breaking down the steps into small components making dances easy to learn. Jerry Ancheta starts the program from 7:00 PM till 9:00 PM. Jerry is the program chair and also the very abled deejay playing selected music.

Filipinos like to eat and socialize. The line dancers are no exception. Each one brings a special dish to share with all. And for about thirty minutes, dancing stops so people can dine and talk with each other. Line dancing also holds a monthly birthday party for those born in that month. During these birthday celebrations, people bring more food and desserts. The community center is also brightly decorated to honor the celebrants. These dinners and birthday celebrations does a lot in solidifying the connections and friendships of all those who attend line dancing.

There is a nominal fee of \$7.00 on the regular weekly line dancing and \$10.00 on the special monthly birthday celebration. The fees are allocated to the building fund and the Lily Ancheta Memorial Scholarship fund. The scholarship fund provides funding to poor but deserving students in the Philippines.

The line dancers have also been serving as ambassadors of good will for PCSNJ, Inc. They are often invited to perform at community events of organizations and religious events in the greater Philadelphia areas.

The line dancing program has lasted this long because the dancers have become close friends. It has become a close knit caring family where people are longing to see each other weekly and share their love of dancing.
